

Dear Michael,

My name is Theo Chino, and I lead the Socialist faction inside the Democratic party.

I am writing to invite you to our County Committee preparatory meeting at the public atrium at the Continental Center at 180 Maiden Lane on Thursday, September 21st, 2023, at 7 pm.

Too many people in the United States have created a false narrative about what Socialism is, and I want to invite you to dispel the myth. When people mention Socialism in the United States, they refer to one of the five types of socialism that existed worldwide at a given time.

If you voted for **Bernie Sanders** at the last primary, you are a Socialist; if you voted for **Andrew Yang**, you might either be a Type I (one) or Type II (two) Socialist; if you voted for **Elizabeth Warren**, you might be Type II (two) Socialist; if you voted for **Howie Hawkins**, you might be a Type II (two) or Type III (three) Socialist.

My type of Socialism is Type II (two), known as the Committee of the Second Socialist International, or simply Socialist International.

Suppose you believe in Free Education, Universal Health Care, Anti-Death Penalty, Pro-Abortion, Universal Basic Income, the Right to Unionize, the sanctity of the Separation of Church and State, and the belief that the Government should make life bearable for all and ensure citizens' Liberties. In that case, there is an excellent chance that you are a Type II (two) Socialist.

Anarchism (type I socialism), Socialism (type II socialism), Communism (type III socialism), and Revolutionary Communism (type IV socialism) have the same common roots that started in France, Germany, England, and the United States at the end of the 19th Century. They found their inspiration in the American and French revolutions.

We are Socialists; therefore, we believe in Free Education, Universal Health Care, Anti-Death Penalty, Pro-Abortion, Universal Basic Income, the Right to Unionize, the sanctity of the Separation of Church and State, and the belief that the Government should make life bearable for all and ensure citizens' Liberties.

Research the story behind Labor Day; you will discover that it's a Socialist holiday commemorating the struggle of the Chicago workers gathered at the Haymarket Square demanding an 8-hour work week in 1886.

The American representatives that included the United Hebrew Trades, the United Brothers League of Iowa, the German Workers Union of New York, the Socialist Labor Party of America, the International Typographical Union, and the Knights of Labor went to Paris and got the resolution on the remembrance of the Haymarket riots.

The world celebrates that remembrance on May 1st, and the United States and Canada on the first Monday of September. **That was us, the Type II** (two) **Socialists.** We enshrined Labor Day.

Who are the Socialists today? Alain Berset, President of Switzerland; Pedro Sanchez, Prime Minister of Spain and European Union President; Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, President of Brazil; António Costa, Prime Minister of Portugal; Olaf Scholz, Chancellor of Germany; Jonas Gahr Støre, Prime Minister of Norway; Marcel Ciolacu, Prime Minister of Romania, Mahmoud Abbas; President of the Palestinian National Authority; Cyril Ramaphosa, President of South Africa; Anthony Albanese, Prime Minister of Australia; Gabriel Boric, President of Chile; Luis Abinader, President of Dominican Republic; António Guterres, United Nation General Secretary; to name a few.

Since 2017, every two years, I have interrupted the County Committee meeting asking for a roll call vote for the election of the chair of the county Democratic party. At every meeting, the leadership does find every excuse unimaginable not to do it. That request only requires one person to demand it to be executed. At every meeting, the leadership breaks the law.

It's time the United States offers the 300 million Americans what we, the New York City government, provide the poorest of its citizens: Free Education, Free Health Care, and much more. It's time we start taking care of each other. It shouldn't be the middle class paying for the poorest but also the 1%. We need to tax the 1%.

The New York County Democratic Party must create a real progressive political platform without any loopholes for the 1%. **We need to tax the rich.**

I was born in France and raised on 141 street. I am a trilingual Dominican French activist and technology professional who worked for a Fortune 500 company for 15 years. As a dual citizen, I have been a member of the French Socialist Party.

After I worked in Silicon Valley during the 2000 Dot Com boom, I ran the Time Warner Cable network overseeing all of their cable boxes and Internet modems. I was laid off after the Spectrum corporate merger because I refused to relocate to Denver and leave the city.

I co-founded Education Française à New York to create real dual-language solutions in the New York City Public School system (P.S. 125 in Harlem and P.S. 58 in Brooklyn). I am a member of my building's Tenant Association, where we oversee our Third Party Transfer program. I raised the alarm on the lack of HPD oversight in this program. I was a voting member of Community Board 9 and a candidate for New York City Public Advocate.



In Paris, I was a member of the executive board of a worldwide association to protect the rights of French emigrants. I invented and set in place strategies used in many successful political campaigns in both Paris and New York City.

I went to college in Alaska and while living there, I fought the oil industry with the Alaska PIRG. I have been an activist since I was 14 years old, starting with selling buttons to raise money for the Anti-Apartheid movement in South Africa.

Always an energetic and innovative activist in all these places, I want to lead Manhattan's Democratic party into the 21st century. Our County Committee can be so much more than it is under the current leadership.

Dear District Leader Frank,

I sent each County Committee member a letter (which I have attached to this email), and I can see that it had some effect on the response one club gave its members (also attached.)

That behavior clearly shows that people don't understand what I am about.

My political view has always been Social Democracy, and around the world, Social Democracy is called Socialism. It's only in the United States that the term has become convoluted to the point that it has allowed American corporations to bully the world.

We are ending this because **New York City is 36% of the diaspora, and half of that diaspora are Social Democrats**. The problem is that it's for them; as I stated above, it's called Socialism and comes attached with all the stigma it implies.

In 2017, I started putting a plan in motion and traveling the world explaining that Socialism was not a bad word. I shared my experience of being labeled as such, working for Time Warner Cable, being a member of my Community Board, or Creating the French/English dual language schools within the DOE.

I know what it is to be a Socialist inside the Democratic party, and many are like me. Please don't take my word about it; ask around. Ask: "What can you tell me about Social Democracy?"

The reality is that the diaspora is not interested in making waves, so they keep quiet. Once in a while, in the privacy of the ballot booth, they will vote for Socialism as they did against Joe Crowley.

I have shared the letter with my worldwide Social Democrat network, and I can say that it reaffirms their belief in the "Stupid and Ignorant Americans" image around the world.

However, it's not all lost, and next Saturday and Sunday, **New York University is organizing a conference on Social Democracy**. Consider taking the time to join a few panels.
