Proposal for Constitutional Amendment: Implementing Nonpartisan Elections in New York State

Introduction:

The current electoral system in New York State, dominated by a two -party structure and enshrined within the state constitution, restricts ballot access and perpetuates partisan gatekeeping. This proposal seeks to amend the New York State Constitution to establish a nonpartisan election system, fostering a more inclusive and representative democracy.

Proposed Amendment:

- Constitutional Revision: Amend the relevant sections of the New York State
 Constitution to remove references to the two -party dominant commissioner of elections.
- 2. **Implementation of Nonpartisan Elections:** Replace the current system with a nonpartisan electoral framework. This can be achieved through:
 - A completely nonpartisan system, where all candidates appear on the ballot without party affiliation.
 - An expanded multi-party system, ensuring representation beyond the two dominant parties, potentially including a five -party structure.
- 3. **Election Administration:** Establish a nonpartisan or multi partisan electoral commission, replacing the current two party structure, to administer elections fairly and impartially.

Objectives:

This amendment aims to achieve the following objectives, as outlined in the New York City Charter Revision Commission's exploration of nonpartisan elections:

- **Broaden Ballot Access:** Ensure that all candidates, regardless of party affiliation, have equal opportunities to compete for public office.
- Reduce Party Gatekeeping: Diminish the exclusionary power of political party leaders in the electoral process, promoting a more open and competitive environment.
- Maintain Party Influence: Preserve the rights of candidates to associate with political parties outside of the ballot and the rights of parties to endorse

candidates, in accordance with First Amendment protections.

Rationale:

The current two - party system creates barriers to entry for independent and third party candidates, limiting voter choice and potentially disenfranchising significant portions of the electorate. A nonpartisan or expanded multi - party system would:

- Promote greater electoral competition.
- Increase voter engagement and participation.
- Enhance the responsiveness of elected officials to the needs of all constituents.
- Increase the representation of diverse viewpoints.
